- Grants Approved: 126
- Percent Approved: 44%

Mardag

- Applications Received: 286
- Grants Approved: 63
- Percent Approved: 22%

Grantmaking

- **Grant types:** All three foundations have continued to adapt grantmaking to be flexible and responsive and will offer **general operating** and **capital support** throughout 2024.
- The Foundations will not be offering program support in 2024
- Grant deadlines: All three foundations <u>open</u> on January 16, 2024 at 10am and remain <u>open until</u> February 7, 2024 at 3pm (<u>register on the portal</u> <u>ahead of time!</u>).
- Current & past grantees: Current grantees are eligible to apply for funding that would begin after the end of their current grant period.

Eligibility

- 501(c)3 organizations, education or governmental units and religious institutions
- Org working with fiscal sponsors
- At least 50% of organization services benefiting East Metro residents

GRANT TYPES:

General Operating

 At least 50% of organization services must benefit East Metro residents

Capital

- Capital projects must be located in the East Metro.
- May be paid over multiple years
- At least 50% of overall organization services must benefit East Metro residents

Exclusions

- Program/project specific requests
- Sectarian religious programs or organizations
- Work by an individual

Mission

Mardag Foundation supports Minnesota nonprofits to remove barriers and create opportunities for low income or traditionally marginalized children, youth and families; older adults with barriers to living independently; and to build capacity of organizations supporting the arts and humanities.



Mardag Foundation Grant Guidelines

- Improving the lives of low-income Children, Youth and Families that lack access to critical opportunities and resources that they need;
- Supporting older adults across Minnesota who lack access or have barriers to critical opportunities to thrive and create community connections;
- Building capacity to improve community vitality through Arts and Culture.

- Eligibility
- 501(c)3 organizations, education or governmental units and religious institutions

GRANT TYPES:

General Operating

Capital

- Capital projects must be located in the East Metro or Greater MN
- May be paid over multiple years
- At least 50% of overall organization services must benefit East Metro and/or Greater MN residents.

Mardag Grant Guidelines Cont.

Exclusions

- Program/project specific requests
- Scholarships and grants to individuals
- Sectarian religious programs or organizations
- Federated campaigns
- Events and conferences
- Capital campaigns of private secondary schools
- Mardag does not accept applications from organizations requiring a fiscal sponsor.
